

passed March 21st, 1867, chapter 329, entitled an Act to provide for the selection, drawing and summoning jurors in the several counties and prescribing their qualifications, and re-enact the same with amendment,

Was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Senate bill entitled an Act to prevent the sale of intoxicating liquors within three miles of the village of Darnestown, Montgomery county, Maryland,

Was taken up, and

Mr. Henkle offered the following amendments:

Section 1, line 1, after sale, insert "bartering or giving."

Section 1, line 2, after the word "liquors," insert "to minors."

Which was adopted.
