On motion by Mr. Clarke,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Clarke, Spates, Smith, Lee, and Biggs to introduce a bill to repeal section 2 of an Act passed February 8th, 1866, chapter 46, entitled an Act to authorize the Governor, Comptroller, and Treasurer to convey to the United States of America the Government house and grounds belonging to the State, in the city of Annapolis, and to procure other site and buildings in lieu thereof.

Senate bill entitled an Act to refund certain sums of money for State taxes erroneously paid into the Treasury of the State by the Society of Redemptorists and by St. Anthony's Orphan Asylum,
