JOINT RESOLUTION :

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That his Excellency, the Governor, be and he is hereby requested to issue a commission, in the usual form, to the Hon. William T. Hamilton, as Senator elect to represent this State in the Congress of the United States for the term of six years from the 4th of March, 1869.

Which was read a first time, and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary.

Also, delivered a bill entitled an Act to repeal chapter 129 of the Acts of 1864, entitled an Act to add additional sections to the 44th Article of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Maryland Hospital," prescribing an additional oath to be taken by the President, Vice-President and Visitors of the said Hospital, and to reinstate the former President, Vice-President and Visitors of the said Hospital in office.

Endorsed, "Passed by yeas and nays."
