House bill entitled an Act to provide for the repairs of the public roads of Howard county.

Which was read the second time.

Mr. Spates, from the Committee on Corporations, reported favorably

House bill entitled an Act to revive and continue in forcethe charter of the Nanticoke Bridge Company,

Which was read the second time.

Mr. Henkle, from the Committee on Internal Improvements, reported unfavorably

House bill entitled an Act to require the railroad companies of this State, to provide a car or cars for the exclusive use of the colored people of this State, and to amend Article 77, of the Code of Public General Laws of the State, entitled, "railroads."

Mr. Earle, from the Committee on Finance, reported favorably

House bill entitled an Act to appropriate a sum of money to pay sundry parties hereinafter named, for publishing the Public General Laws, passed at January sessions of 1866 and 1867.
