One thousand copies of the Report of the Survey of a Rail Road Route connecting the city of Baltimore with Drum Point on the Patuxent River, by Col. George W. Hughes, Chief Engineer.

Were ordered to be printed.

BY THE SENATE,

January 31, 1868.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates:

We have received your message proposing that the Joint Committee of seven, appointed to visit and examine into the condition of all the benevolent and reformatory institutions, which are beneficiaries of the State, be authorized and directed, to visit and examine into the condition of all such benevolent and charitable institutions which have applied or may during the session apply to the General Assembly for relief, or may request said committee to make such visit and examination; concur so far, that the visits of said committee shall not extend to any institutions beyond the limits of the city of Baltimore, or to those that may hereafter apply.
