The Senate went into Executive Session.

After a short session the Senate resumed the consideration of legislative business.

An Act to repeal sections 44, 45 and 46, of Article 16, of the Code of Public Local Laws, entitled Prince George's county, under head of Collectors, and sections 47, 48 and 49,
