

Twenty thousand dollars to deepen harbor

Sec. 127. The proceeds of auction duties to the amount of twenty thousand dollars shall be appropriated annually for the purpose of deepening and improving a channel in the Chesapeake Bay and Patapsco river, and the harbor of the city of Baltimore; and the Treasurer shall, upon the warrant of the Comptroller, disburse and pay over to the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore all such duties, to be applied under their direction to the purpose aforesaid.

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 14.

AN ACT entitled "An Act to incorporate the Marine Railway and Manufacturing Company of Havre de Grace, and to amend the Act of 1867, Chapter 211."

Incorporated—power and privileges.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Robert R. Vandiver, Israel Allen, Sr., Joseph M. Simmons, John Duboise, John Thompson Frieze, their associates, successors and assigns, be and they hereby are created a body corporate by the name and style of the Marine Railway and Manufacturing Company of Havre de Grace, and by that name shall have perpetual succession, shall be capable in law to hold and dispose of property, real, personal and mixed, fee simple or leasehold, to sue and be sued, to plead and be impleaded, and answer and defend, to be answered and defended in any Court of law or equity and in any other place whatsoever, to receive and make deeds and contracts, to make, have and use a common seal, and renew, alter and change the same at pleasure, to ordain and establish such by laws, ordinances and regulations as may appear necessary for regulating the concerns of said corporation not being contrary to this Act,
