liabilities made and entered into by him, and may sue and be sued as fully as if he was of full age.

In force.

Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 18.

AN ACT to make valid the official Acts of the Justices of the Peace, Constables and Supervisors of the Public Roads in Wicomico county.

Justices of Peace, Constables and Road Supervisors. Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That all the official Acts of the several Justices of the Peace, Constables and Road Supervisors residing and acting within the limits of Wicomico county, who received their appointments as such for the counties of Somerset and Worcester, be and the same are hereby ratified and confirmed and made as good and binding in law as if they had been duly appointed and qualified as officers for Wicomico county until their successors shall have been appointed and qualified; provided the same be not otherwise defective for reasons other than want of jurisdiction.

Judgment.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That Justices of the Peace, resident within the limits of Somerset or Worcester county, who may have rendered judgment against any person resident within the limits of Wicomico county, from whose judgment an appeal has been prayed, within sixty days from the rendition thereof, shall transmit the papers in such case together with a copy of the judgment rendered therein to the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Wicomico county for review in said Court.

Exceeding fifty dollars.

Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That all judgments rendered by the Justices of the Peace of Wicomico county for any sum exceeding fifty dollars (provided a certified copy thereof be recorded in the office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court for said county,) shall be a lien upon the real estate of the defendant.
