Hamilton as United States Senator, and whether the said election was or was not in conflict with the Acts of 1865 and 1866, chap. 245, of the laws of the United States, and Art. 2 of the Declaration of Rights of the present Constitution of Maryland, or any law of the State of Maryland; and whether in his opinion, or not, the Governor of this State is not bound under the Act of Congress and the Constitution of this State, above referred to, to issue a certificate of election to the Hon. Wm. T. Hamilton as Senator elect for this State for six years from the 4th day of March 1869.
