CHAPTER 71.

AN ACT for the relief of William H. Peake and David White, of Anne Arundel County.

Adjust errors.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the County Commissioners of Anne Arundel County be and they are hereby authorized to correct the errors in assessment and valuation of the land and premises of William H. Peake and David White, erroneously assessed under the Act of Assembly of eighteen hundred and sixty-six, Chapter one hundred and fifty-seven, and the said Commissioners are hereby empowered to adjust the errors in the aforesaid assessment.

In force.

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 72.

AN ACT to authorize the Comptroller and Treasurer, when ascertaining the amount of paid up subscriptions to the Capital Stock of the Queen Anne's and Kent County Railroad Company, to estimate the bonds of Queen Anne's County as cash, at a specified rate per cent.

Preamble.

WHEREAS, The contract for the construction of the Queen Anne's and Kent Railroad contains a
