to incorporate the Western Run Turnpike Company, passed in 1867, chapter 396, with proposed amendment.

Amendment proposed:

Section 4, line 4, after the word "county," insert the words, subject to the provisions of Article 3, section 54 of the Constitution of Maryland.

Which was adopted,

And the bill as amended, was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Sudler, Chairman of a Select Committee, reported favorably the Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal sections 37, 38, 39, 46, 47, 48 and 54, of Article 17, of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to the town of Centreville, Queen Anne's county, and to re-enact the following as substitutes therefor.

Which was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
