Which was read and referred to the Committee on Education.

Mr. Guy, (the rules being suspended,) presented the petition of the residents of Bladensburg, Prince George's county, asking the passage of an Act authorizing the Commissioners of said town, to levy annually on the property within the limits of said town, the sum of fifteen cents on the hundred dollars, for the purpose of improving the streets and public property of said town.

JOINT RESOLUTION.
