

On motion of Mr. Smith, of Worcester,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Ways and Means to report a bill providing for the publication of the Public General Laws in additional newspapers.

On motion of Mr. Poteet,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations to introduce a bill to incorporate the Commerce Insurance Company of Baltimore.

On motion of Mr. Legg,

Leave was granted to the Committee on the Judiciary to introduce a bill entitled an Act to provide for a new code of all the statute laws of the State, and to appropriate a sum of money for that purpose.

Also,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Legg, Poteet and Pentland to introduce a bill to repeal the Act of 1865, chapter 130, entitled an Act to provide for the registration of Births, Marriages and Deaths.

On motion of Mr. Sanner,

Leave was granted to the Committee on the Judiciary to report a bill to repeal secs. 179 and 180, of Article 30, of the Code of Public General Laws relating to Sabbath breaking, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

On motion of Mr. Bond, of Calvert,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations to introduce a bill to incorporate the Baltimore and Drum Point Rail Road Company.

Mr. Mitchell, Chairman of the Committee on the Judiciary, reported favorably,

A bill entitled an Act to facilitate the examination of titles to land in Baltimore County, by authorizing the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Baltimore County to make out general indexes to the law and equity dockets in his office, and to provide for paying for the same.

Which was read a first time.

Also,

The Senate bill entitled an Act for the relief of Benjamin Frost, alias Waters.

Which was read a second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
