Ordered, That the Chief Clerk be instructed to provide for each member of this House a copy of the rules adopted for its government as soon as practicable.

Leave was granted to the Committee on Colored Population to introduce a bill to amend Article sixty of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Licenses," by adding thereto an additional section.

On motion of Mr. Harden,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Harden, Slingluff, Williams, Touchstone and Smith, of Worcester, to introduce a bill entitled an Act to repeal the Act of 1867, chapter 329, entitled an act to provide for the selection, drawing and summoning of jurors in the several counties, and prescribing their qualifications.
