The bill entitled an Act to amend the charter of the Baltimore and Jerusalem Turnpike Company, passed at January session, 1867, so as to increase the capital stock of the said company,

The bill entitled an Act to authorize the County Commissioners of Anne Arundel county, to allow the Sheriff of said county additional compensation for boarding prisoners,

Was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled an Act to require all local insurance companies doing business in the city of Baltimore, to make annual statements of their condition to the Comptroller of the Treasury,

Was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled an Act to repeal sections 1, 37, 38, 39, 40, and 2, of chapter 252, of the Laws of Maryland, passed January session, 1867, entitled an Act to repeal the 37th, 38th, 39th and 40th sections of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Licenses," and substitute in lieu thereof the following sections,
