The bill entitled an Act to give the assent of the Legislature of this State to a bequest in the will of Susan A. Goodwin, late of Charles county, deceased, to the vestry of Trinity Parish, in said county,

Was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The hour having arrived for taking up the order of the day, the House proceeded to the consideration of

The bill entitled an Act to repeal an Act passed February 5th, 1867, chapter 24, entitled an Act to add two additional sections to the 30th Article of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Crimes and Punishments," relating to Funerals.

Which was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
