Which was adopted.

Ordered, That a committee of three be appointed to make inquiries of Charles Wilson Peale, as to a certain portrait of Lord Baltimore, now in the possession of said Peale, and report to this House the amount for which said portrait may be purchased.

Mr. Smith, of Baltimore city, submitted the following order:

Ordered, That a committee of five be appointed by the Chair to take up the new Constitution and refer such matters therein as require the action of this House, to proper committees.

Mr. Stewart, of Dorchester, submitted the following order: Ordered, By the House of Delegates, of Maryland, that when this House adjourns for any week day, except on Saturday, at or after 3 o'clock, P. M., 'til Monday, at 11½ A. M., the Chief Clerk be directed to deduct the per diem of the members for the time for which the House so adjourns.
