

Being upon a second reading,

Mr. Marshall submitted the following amendment :

Section 13. *Be it enacted*, That this company shall not be authorized to charge tolls on any vehicle or horse passing over this road for the purpose of going to or from a funeral.

Was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
