Which was read, assented to, and sent to the Senate.

The Secretary of the Senate returned the House bill entitled an Act to incorporate the German Savings Bank of Maryland, endorsed "passed by yeas and nays, with proposed amendment."

Amendment proposed :

Strike out the eleventh section, and insert the following in lieu thereof:

The stockholders of said bank shall be liable to the amount of their respective share or shares of stock in said bank or banking institution for all its debts and liabilities upon note or notes, bill or bills, or otherwise. The books, papers, and accounts of said bank shall be open to inspection under such regulations as may be prescribed by law.
