Leave was granted to the Allegany delegation to report a bill to amend the charter of the Cumberland and Pennsylvania Rail Road Company.

On Motion of Mr. Corbin,

Leave was granted Messrs. Corbin, Horsey and Holloway, to introduce a bill to make valid certain official acts of John Miller, as a Justice of the Peace for Somerset county.

On motion of Mr. Latrobe,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations to report a bill relating to the American Life Insurance and Trust Company, reviving the supplements to the Act incorporating said company, so far as to enable the attorney of said company to settle any transaction of sail company still open and outstanding.

Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations to introduce a bill to incorporate the German Savings Bank of Maryland.
