

The bill entitled an Act to appropriate the sum of money therein mentioned to pay John Stevens Sellman, of Anne Arundel county, for his services as an Elector of the Senate of 1836.

Was read a third time.

Mr. Legg moved that the bill be indefinitely postponed.

Decided in the negative.

Mr. Coudy moved that the bill be recommitted to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Decided in the negative.

The bill was then rejected (for want of a constitutional majority) by yeas and nays as follows :
