State of Maryland, and to repeal all laws inconsistent therewith.

Said bill being upon a second reading,

Mr. Iglehart submitted the following amendment:

Section 1, strike out all after the word "Act," in the 3d line.

Pending the consideration of which,

On motion of Mr. Iglehart,

The House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole to consider the bill entitled an Act to add a new Article to the Code of Public General Laws, to be entitled "Public Education," providing a general system of Free Public Schools for the State of Maryland, and to repeal all laws inconsistent therewith, with pending amendments,

Mr. Brown in the chair.

After some time spent in Committee of the Whole,

The committee rose,

(The Speaker resumed the chair,) and through Mr. Brown, Chairman, reported that they had had under consideration the bill entitled an Act to add a new Article to the Code of Public General Laws, to be entitled "Public Education," providing a general system of Free Public Schools for the State of Maryland, and to repeal all laws inconsistent therewith, with pending amendment,

Had made some progress thereon, and asked leave to sit again.

The report was received, and leave granted.
