

Leave was granted to the Prince George's and Montgomery delegations to introduce a bill to run the boundary line between Prince George's and Montgomery counties, and to mark the same.

On motion of Mr. Keech,

Leave was granted to the Committee on the Judiciary to introduce a bill to repeal sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 of Article 53 of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to landlord and tenant, and tenants holding over, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Also, leave was granted to the Prince George's delegation to introduce a bill repealing all the Public Local Law of Prince George's county from section 1 to 182, inclusive, and to re-enact the same with amendments and additional sections.

Mr. Iglehart, Chairman of the Committee on Corporations, reported back the bill entitled an Act entitled a supplement to an Act passed by the General Assembly of Maryland at January session, 1864, chapter 96, entitled an Act to incorporate the Liberty and New Windsor Turnpike Road Company, in Frederick and Carroll counties, which had been recommitted to said committee.

Said bill being upon a second reading,

Mr. Bowlus submitted the following amendment ;

Section 1st, strike out all after the word "empower," in the 9th line, to the word "to," in the 18th line of same section ;

Which was adopted.

The bill, as amended, was then read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
