Which was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The Senate bill entitled an Act to aid in the establishment of a Hospital in connection with the Washington University of Baltimore, and to appropriate money for the same.

Mr. Stewart, of Dorchester, moved to amend the first section of the bill by striking out all the titles attached to the names of the corporators therein,

Which amendment was adopted.

The bill was then read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The Senate bill entitled an Act to authorize the Comptroller of the Treasury to adjust and settle the accounts due by collectors, sheriffs, clerks, registers and other receivers of the public moneys, in cases where the indebtedness accrued prior to the year 1866.

Which was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
