Which was read a second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Also, favorably

A bill entitled an Act to repeal section 17, of Article 30, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Crimes and Punishments," under the head of "Bribery," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Which was read a first time.

Mr. Brown, Chairman of the Committee on Inspections, reported favorably

The Senate bill entitled an Act to provide for the appointment of a measurer of charcoal for Baltimore city, from the State at large.

Said bill being upon a second reading,

Mr. Conway moved to strike out the enacting clause of the bill.

The question then being upon concurring in the motion to strike out the enacting clause,

Mr. Conway demanded the yeas and nays.
