Ordered, That no member or officer shall receive more than \$50 worth of postage stamps, and that the Postmaster be required to furnish each member, together with the Chief Clerk, Recording Clerk and Journal Clerk, with that amount, the other officers to be supplied with stamps to the amount of \$5.
