Amendments proposed:

Amend section 9, line 3, by striking out the words "January, 1869," and substituting therefor, the words September, 1868.

Add additional section after section 9, as follows:

And be it enacted, That the Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized from the proceeds of any sales of bonds which may be made under the provisions of this Act, to reimburse the Treasury for such advances from the general revenue actuing from taxes or other sources as have been appropriated from time to time towards the payment of bounties, the same obe applied to the general wants of the Treasury.
