The bill entitled an Act to amend an Act to incorporate a company to build a Turnpike road from the Georgetown Turnpike to the public road leading from Adamstown to Greenfield Mills, passed by the General Assembly of Maryland at its January session, in the year 1860, chapter 323.

The bill entitled an Act to prohibit horse racing on the public roads of Queen Anne's county.

The bill entitled an Act to add to Article 19, of the Code of Public Local Laws of Somerset county, entitled "Jurors," an additional section.

The bill entitled an Act supplemental to an Act entitled an Act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from Ellicott City to Elysville, in Howard county.

The bill entitled an Act to add additional sections to Article 16, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Chancery," to come in after section 78 of said Article.
