Add after the word "Baltimore," in line 5, the words, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Which was adopted.

The title, as amended, was then adopted.

The bill was then sent to the Senate.

The next order of the day was taken up for consideration, being

The bill entitled an Act to afford protection to persons in the State of Maryland, consigning flour, grain, tobacco, and all other agricultural products to Baltimore city, for sale, and to add the following sections, providing therefor, to Article 30 of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled Urimes and Punishments.

Said bill being upon a second reading,

The question recurring upon the adoption of the amendment submitted by Mr. Rose,

Sub-section 209, line 21, strike out the words "thirty-three."

Which was rejected.

Mr. Montague submitted the following amendment:

Section 208, after the word "thereof," in line 11, add, and shall state the balance of amount due by the consignor, and if said amount be not paid within the space of thirty-three days, then the said commission merchant may attach the property of said consignor upon identification of the same under oath before a Justice of the Peace, and sell the same, or have the same sold, at the expense of the consignor, at public auction, the nett proceeds of which he shall be entitled to, in so far, and no farther, as will satisfy his claim, the balance to be paid over to the consignor by the said commission merchant.

Which was rejected.

Mr. Legg submitted the following amendment:

At the close of section 208, insert, "and no provision of this section shall be construed as giving to the consignee the
