In what place, bastardy pleaded against him that is born out of the realm, shall be tried. (Part.)

The part of this statute declaring that children, inheritors, born out of the liegance of the king, whose parents at the time of their birth should be at the faith and liegance of the king, should inherit, &c. must have been in force in the province, together with the other statutes on the subject.
