Discharged from serving on juries, &c. 5 Hen. 8, Ch. 6.

*Pleadings.*

Directed to be in English, &c. 36 Edward 3, St. 1, Ch. 15.

Defendants permitted to plead several matters. 4 Anne, Ch. 16, S. 4.

Dilatory pleas not to be received without affidavit. 4 Anne, Ch. 16, S. 11.

In actions on judgments, bonds, &c. payment may be pleaded. 4 Anne, Ch. 16, S. 12.
