the full value thereof, and be sentenced to the penitentiary for not less than two nor more than twelve years.

COUNTERFEITING AND FORGERY.

- 24. Any person who shall falsely make, forge or counterfeit, or cause, or procure to be falsely made, forged or counterfeited, or willingly aid or assist in falsely making, forging, altering or counterfeiting any deed, will, testament or codicil, bond, writing obligatory, bill of exchange, promissory note for the payment of money or property, endorsement or assignment of any bond, writing obligatory, bill of exchange, acquittance or receipt for money or property, or any acquittance or receipt either for money or property, with intention to defraud any person whomsoever, or shall utter or publish as true, any false, forged, altered or counterfeited deed, will, testament, or codicil, bond, writing obligatory, bill of exchange, promissory note for the payment of money or property, or endorsement or assignment of any bond, writing obligatory, bill of exchange, promissory note, acquittance or receipt for money or property, shall be deemed a felon, and on being thereof convicted shall be sentenced to the penitentiary for not less than five nor more than ten years.
- 25. If any person shall falsely make, forge, or counterfeit, or cause to be falsely made, forged, or counterfeited, or willingly aid or assist in falsely making, forging or counterfeiting, any commission, patent or pardon, or any warrant, certificate, or other public security, whereby money may be drawn from the treasury of this State, or shall be concerned in printing, writing, signing, or passing any such forged or counterfeited warrant, certificate or public security, knowing it to be such, with intention to defraud any person or persons, he shall be deemed a felon, and, on being convicted thereof, shall be sentenced to the penitentiary for a period not less than two nor more than ten years.
- 26. Every person who shall be convicted of the crime of counterfeiting the great seal of the State for the time being, or the seal of any court, or any other public seal of this State, and of making use of the same, or of stealing any of the said true seals, or of unlawfully, falsely and corruptly, or with evil intent, affixing any of them to any deed, warrant, or writing, or who shall be convicted of having in his possession or custody such counterfeit instrument, and shall wilfully conceal the same,
