28th. That the defendant debauched and carnally knew the plaintiff's wife.

29th. That the defendant converted to his own use, or wrongfully deprived the plaintiff of the use and possession of the plaintiff's goods; that is to say, wheat, rye, household furniture, (or as the case may be.)

32d. That the defendant falsely and maliciously spoke and published of the plaintiff the words following, that is to say: "he is a thief;" (if there be any special damage, here state it with such reasonable particularity as to give notice to the defendant of the particular injury complained of, for instance,) whereby the plaintiff lost his situation of book-keeper in the Bank of Washington.

33d. That defendant falsely and maliciously printed and published of the plaintiff in a newspaper called "The Examiner," the words following, that is to say: "he forswore himself."

34th. That the defendant is a corporation, owning a railroad between B. and C.; that the plaintiff was a passenger on said railroad, and by reason of the insufficiency of an axle of the car in which he was riding, the plaintiff was hurt; and the defendant did not use due care in reference to said axle, but the plaintiff did use due care.

[This form may be varied so as to adapt it to many cases, by merely changing the allegation as to the cause of the accident.]
