#### ALMS-HOUSE.

SECTION 1. There shall be annually appointed seven trustees of the poor of Baltimore city and county, four of whom shall be residents in the city of Baltimore, and shall be appointed by the mayor and city council in the same manner as officers under the corporation are appointed, and the other three shall be residents of Baltimore county, and shall be appointed by the county commissioners of said county; and all vacancies that shall occur shall be filled by appointments to be made in the same manner.

2. The trustees so appointed, and their successors, are declared to be a body politic and corporate by the name, style and title of "The Trustees for the Poor of Baltimore city and county," and by that name shall have perpetual succession, and shall be capable in law to sue and be sued, to purchase, take, and hold, use or sell, convey and deliver all kinds of lands, tenements, estates, property, and effects real, personal, and mixed.
