Hereas fince his Majesties late Proclamation against Carriages and 'Waggons that bring great loads to the City of London, from many parts of this Kingdom with above five Horses in a Team, to the decay of His Majesties High ways, many have notwithstanding by subtilty instead of Horses, drawn their said load with Oxen and Horses above the faid number, thinking thereby to avoid the danger. It is now ordered and fo determined, That from henceforth three Oxen shall be taken in the case for two Horses, and sour Oxen for three Horses, and so after the rate.
