To conceal such Bull (on Writing) or such absolution offered them, 13 El. 2.

is misprission of Treason.

To purchase or pursue (in the Court of Rome, or elsewhere) any Expression Bull or other Instrument, against the King, his Crown, or Realm; or to bring them within this Realm; or to receive them, or to make notification or any other execution thereof, within this Realm, or without, every such Offender, their Procurers, Maintainers, Abettors and Counsellors, shall incur the danger of a Premunire, 16 R.2. cap.5.

To practife (beyond the Seas or upon the Seas, or elsewhere within the 34 El. 16 A Jac. 4 Kings Dominions) totabsolve, perswade or withdraw any Subject, or any P.Romeri Within any his Highness Dominions, from their Obedience to His Majesty; 23 El. 16 Or for reconcile them, to the Pope, or to draw them to the Romish Religion (by Argument, Books or otherwise) for that intent; or to move them to promise Obedience to the See of Rome, or to any other Prince, State or 3 Jac. 4 Potentate; every such Person, and their Procurers, Aiders, Counsellors, and Maintainers, knowing the same are all in case of High Treason.

To be willingly absolved, perswaded, withdrawn or reconciled, as afore3 Jac. 4.
said, or to promise any such Obedience, every such person, and their Pro8. Reconstructions, Counsellors, Aiders and Maintainers (knowing the same) shall be 49.
adjudged Traytors, except they submit themselves, according to the Sta9. Rom. 4.
tute, within six days after their return into this Realm, &c. Videa antea, sit.

To conceal any such Offence, and not within 20 days to disclose it to some Justice of Peace or other higher Officer, is misprisson of Treason by the Stat. 23 El. 1. P. Rome 8.

Again, for any Jesuit, Priest or other Ecclesiastical Person (born within 27 El. 2. any the Kings Dominions) and made by any Authority from the Bishop of P. Jesuit Rome, to come into, be or remain, in any of the Kings Dominions, contrary to the Statute, is High Treason.

To receive, relieve, aid or maintain any such Jesuit, &c. (being at li-r. Jesus berty, and knowing him to be a Jesuit, &c.) is Felony, without benefit of 2. 101. Clergy, 27 El. cap. 2. "But that clause relates to such as had before that "time taken Orders. See the Statute.

To conceal such a Jesuit, &c. sc. sc. not to discover them to some Justice of Peace, or other higher Officer, within twelve days, is punishable by Fine and Imprisonment.

And the Justice of Peace or other such Officer, to whom such a person shall be discovered, if within 28 days they give not information thereof to some of the Kings Council, &c. they shall forfeit 200 Marks. See plus, 27 EL. 2. tit. Recusants.
