A Servant that is departed out of service, and a Year after killeth his samí. 10. Master upon malice conceived when he was in the said service, it is Petty Treason, Br. Treas. 151. 33 Ass. 1. 7. Co. 1. 99 b. 35 35 35 35

A Servant doth procure another to kill his Master, who killeth him in the Cromp.19 Servants presence; this is Petty Treason in the Servant, and Murther in the other. See Plo. 100. a. & Br. Coro. 119. & gnere, in hint

But if the stranger doth kill the Master in the Servants absence, then the Dyer 228. Servant is only accessory to the Murther, but it is no Petry Treason in

A Servant conspireth with a stranger to Rob his Master, and at a time Dyer 128. appointed in the night, he letteth in the ftranger into the House, and leads him to his Masters Chamber, and the stranger killeth his Master, the servant standing by but saying nothing, this is Petty Treason in the servant, and Murder in the stranger: yet by some, this is but Murther in the servant; Ibid. & 40. Aff. Br. Cor. 119. For where the principal is but a Felon, the accessary cannot be a Traytor. See Plo. 100. a. that the servant is a principal in this case, and after, tit. Accessary.

A servant commands one to beat his Master, and he killeth him, this is Cromp.20

Perry Treason in the servant, if he be present.

A servant upon malice prepensed, shooteth at a stranger, and misself Cromp.20 him, and killeth his Master being by; this is Petty Treason in the servant; (though he intended no hurt to his, Master, yet) because he intended Murther thereby.

The Wife maliciously killeth her Husband, this is Petty Treason, 25 Ed. Br. Treal. The Husband maliciously killeth his Wife, this is but Murther.

The reason of this difference, is, for that the one is in subjection and

oweth obedience, and not the other.

The Wife and a Servant do conspire to kill the Husband, and the Ser-Dyct 332. vant killeth him in the Wives absence; this is Petty Treason in them both

The Wife and a stranger do conspire to kill her Husband, and he killeth Dyer Ib. her Husband in the Wives absence; this is no Petty Treason in the Wife, but Murther in the stranger, and she shall be hanged as accessary to the Murther.

Also where the Wise or Servant procuring, conspiring or practiling fuch Murther, at the time of fuch Murther is in the same house, though they be not present thereat, but are in another Room, yet it is Petty Treafon in them, as it seemeth by two cases reported by Master Crompton in 4 0 5 Mar.

The Wife poysoneth a thing, to the intent to poyson her Husband there-Plo. 474. Co. 9. 8 r. with, the Husband eateth of it, and becometh very fick thereof, but recoin the title vereth, after a stranger eateth thereof, and dyeth thereof, this is only Murof Murder ther in the Wife.

The Wife poyloneth an Apple to the intent to poylon a stranger there-Ctom: 20. with, and layeth it to that purpose in a secret place, and the Husband by chance eateth of it, and dyeth thereof within a year and a day, this is Petty Treason in the Wife, for that she intended Murther thereby.

The Wife poysoneth an Apple or other thing, and delivereth it to B_i (knowing nothing of the poylon) to give to C. and B. giveth it to the Crossp.20 Husband, (without the assent of the Wife) who eateth thereof in the Wifes absence, and he dyeth thereof, this is Petty Treason in the Wife.

And yet if Alay impoyloned fruit for a stranger, being his Enemy, and his Father or Mother come and eat it, Sir Fr. Bacon maketh a quere whe-
