other Duties are due by vertue of one Act of 12 Car. 2. c. 14. To be land ed or conveied away, without entry first made, and the Customer, Collector, or his Deputy first agreed with, upon Oath made before (amongst others) the chief Magistrate of the Port, or Place where the Offence shall be committed, or the place next adjoyning, he may issue out a Warrant to any person or persons, enabling them, with the assistance of a Sheriss, Justice of Peace, or Constable to enter any House in the day time, where the Goods are suspected to be concealed, and in case of resistance to break the House and seize the Goods; but no House shall be entred, but within a Month after the Ofsence committed; and if upon such Information a House be searched, and prove salse, the party shall recover his sull damage and costs against such Information, to continue until the end of the first Session of next Parliament.

## CHAP. XXXIV. Custos Rotulorum, and Clerks of the Peace.

'have a Bill figned with the Kings hand for the fame, which Bill figned fhall be a fufficient Warrant for the Lord Chancellor, or Lord 'Keeper to grant a Commission to that purpose, until the King in like manner shall assign another.

'Every Custos Rotulorum shall nominate and appoint every person, who 37 H. 8.1. 'shall be Clerk of the Peace, and to grant such Offices to such able persons instructed in the Laws, as shall be able to use the same, for the time the Custos Retulorum shall continue in his Office.

## CHAP. XXXV. V. 18. Dying.

Pon Information given to any Justice of Peace against any person 29 EL 18 suspected to offend this Statute concerning the using of Logwood. alias Blockwood, in Dying, such Justice may by his Warrant, or other Commandment, cause to come before him, and may examine by Oath or otherwife, the Servants or Workmen of such suspected Offenders, and other persons able to disclose the Offence: And upon finding the same, (sc. that any person hath used, or caused to be used in the Dying or Colouring of any Cloth, Wool, Yarn, Grogram, Buffins, or Silk, or any thing made of Woollen. Yarn, or Silk, any Logwood, the faid Justice shall bind with Surcties (to the next Gaol-delivery, or Quarter-Sessions of that County) as well such suspected Offenders, there to make answer for the said Offence, as the Examinates which do discover the Offence; and shall also certific thither the faid Examinations: And if such suspected Offender shall resuse to be bound then may fuch Justice send such suspect to the next Gaol there to remain till he or the shall become so bound with Sureties.' And the Justices of Peace &c. may indict and convict the Offenders, and fet them in the Pillory, for fuch time as they shall think fit, and the party shall forseit 20 l. Gc.

Any two Justices of the Peace of the County where any. Logwood shall be found (in whose hands soever it shall be) may cause the same to be burned
