## MARYLAND YOUTH COMMISSION.

Created by Joint Resolution 24 of the 1937 Legislature, it is the duty of this Commission to receive and study the report of the American Youth Commission and such other data as may be available relating to the prevalence of crime, industrial opportunities and the educational and recreational needs affecting the youth of this State, and to recommend to the next General Assembly such plans as may be considered necessary to meet existing needs. It is the duty of this Commission to report its recommendations to the Governor for
