equipment and expenditures for transportation, cost less per pupil than rural schools having one or two teachers, chiefly because the classes were larger. Transportation was provided at public expense for nearly 49,000 county pupils at a cost of \$952,600.

There were 57.8 per cent of the white county schools, and 82 per cent of the colored schools in the counties which reported that they had active parent-teacher associations organized in 1936.

Maryland's school system is frequently visited and studied by officials from other States and counties because of its plan for effective administration and supervision in a county unit system, and because of its method of distributing school funds on the basis of need through its Equalization Fund.

## Board of Education-Baltimore City.

The public school system of Baltimore is separate and distinct from the school system of the State, is controlled by a board of nine members appointed by the Mayor of Baltimore, and not under the jurisdiction of the State Board of Education.
