

a member of the State Banking Commission appointed by Governor Ritchie to review the State Banking Laws and Regulations. Mr. Miles was Chairman of the State Democratic Campaign Committee during the Gubernatorial and Congressional campaign of 1934 and was elected Treasurer of Maryland by the General Assembly at its session of 1935 and assumed the duties of that office January 29, 1935. By virtue of his office as Treasurer of Maryland, he is a member of the Board of Trustees and Treasurer of the State Teachers' Retirement System and a member of the Boards of the several State-owned institutions.

Since May, 1932, he was President of County Trust Company of Maryland (formerly The Eastern Shore Trust Company), which company operates banks in ten counties of Maryland, with its main bank in Cambridge and its executive offices in Baltimore City, until March, 1937, when he resigned, upon his election as Executive Vice-President and a director of the Baltimore National Bank.

Mr. Miles was married in 1919 to Miss A. Frances Williams, daughter of the late L. Ernest and Georgia Todd Williams of Salisbury. Mr. and Mrs. Miles reside in Salisbury and have three children.

### CLERK OF THE COURT OF APPEALS

*Clerk of the Court of Appeals:* JAMES A. YOUNG (Democrat), Cumberland, Maryland.

James A. Young was born at Keyser, West Virginia, May 4, 1879. Two years later his parents moved into Allegany County. He attended the public schools in Barton, Moscow Mills and Cumberland. He learned the job printing trade in the plant of the Evening Times in Cumberland, and for a while was foreman, and then engaged in the job printing business in Cumberland.

On June 26, 1900, Mr. Young married Miss Daisy Wilson White, a native of Cumberland. He is a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church, and is actively identified with several fraternal societies.

Mr. Young comes from a prominent family, his father, John W. Young, having been twice elected Clerk of Court for Allegany County as a Democrat, although the county is strongly Republican. He has held responsible political positions, having been clerk of the Board of Election Supervisors, and in 1921 was elected a Road Director for Allegany County.
