and 16 years on commitment of any Court, Juvenile Court, or Justice of the Peace. School classes are available through the eighth grade and Practical Arts Courses in agricultural and industrial lines. Related subjects classes are included in practical arts courses.

## BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND

CHAPTER 925 - ACTS OF 1941.

The Board shall consist of eleven members who shall be appointed by the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate. The nine members of the existing Board shall serve for the terms for which appointed, and the two additional members shall be appointed for original terms of 7 and 9 years, respectively from the 1st Monday in June, 1941; thereafter for terms of nine years. The two additional members first appointed and their successors shall be selected from lists of nominees which shall be submitted to the Governor by the Maryland State Grange and the Maryland Farm Bureau, respectively, and shall contain the names of at least two nominees for each office to be filled. Said Board shall also act as the State Board of Agriculture.

## THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND

The University of Maryland is located at College Park, in Prince George's County, eight miles from Washington and thirty-two miles from Baltimore. The campus fronts on the Baltimore-Washington Boulevard.

The Professional Schools of Medicine, Nursing, Pharmacy, Dentistry, and Law, and the University Hospital, are located in Baltimore in the vicinity of Lombard and Greene Streets.

The Negro Branch of the University is located at Princess Anne in Somerset County.

## Administration.

The government of the University is vested by law in a Board of Regents, consisting of nine members appointed by the Governor each for a term of nine years. The administration of the University is vested in the President. The General Administrative Board acts in an advisory capacity of the President.

The University organization comprises the following administrative divisions:
