agencies, and the supervision of the law prohibiting the separation of infants from their mothers during the first six months after birth.

The State Department is authorized to create or continue in each county a County Welfare Board, constituting an administrative department of the local government, with authority to administer, under the supervision, direction and control of the State Department, Aid to Dependent Children, Old Age Assistance, Public Assistance to the Needy Blind, General Public Assistance, Child Welfare Services under the Social Security Act, the investigation and certification of persons eligible for employment on projects of the Work Projects Administration, Public Works Administration and Civilian Conservation Corps, and to administer, handle and distribute Federal Surplus commodities, as well as work relief and services to families and individuals in need, and the care of neglected, dependent and delinquent children, which care shall include the rendering of probation service to juvenile courts or other courts having jurisdiction over minors. Each County Board consists of seven persons, one of whom shall be a County Commissioner. Appointments to vacancies occurring in 1941 shall be for the term of three years. Thereafter all appointments shall be for sixyear terms.
