Appropriations available to the Commission for the construction of roads will be supplemented by earnings from Federal aid appropriations and by proceeds from the sale of State Highway Construction Bonds. Federal aid appropriations to the State of Maryland for 1951 primary, secondary, and urban programs total \$4,272,072. At December 31, 1950, State Highway Construction Bonds totaling \$50,000,000 had been issued out of a total authorized issue of \$100,000,000; further sales of bonds will be made as funds are required to meet expenditures in connection with the expanded road construction program.

In addition, funds administered by the Baltimore National Bank, as Trustee, are available to the Commission for the construction of the Chesapeake Bay Bridge. Such funds have been provided from the sale of \$43,925,000 Bridge Revenue Bonds, all of which were outstanding at December 31, 1950.
