

agency under the provisions of this section as they may deem proper and expedient.

(D) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY MAY PLACE SUCH OTHER AND FURTHER RESTRICTIONS OR LIMITATIONS ON THE EXERCISE OF ANY OF THE POWERS PROVIDED FOR IN THIS SECTION, AS IT MAY DEEM PROPER AND EXPEDIENT.

(e) *The provisions of this section are independent of, and shall in no way affect, the powers granted under Article XII of the Constitution of Maryland, title "City of Baltimore—Land Development and Redevelopment."* ALSO, THE POWER PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION FOR THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO ENACT PUBLIC LOCAL LAWS AUTHORIZING ANY MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OR ANY COUNTY TO CARRY OUT URBAN RENEWAL PROJECTS PREVAILS OVER THE RESTRICTIONS CONTAINED IN ARTICLE 11A "LOCAL LEGISLATION" AND IN ARTICLE 11E "MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS" OF THIS CONSTITUTION.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted,* That the foregoing section hereby proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of this State, at the next general election to be held in this State in the year 1960, shall be submitted to the legal and qualified voters thereof for their adoption or rejection in pursuance of the directions contained in Article XIV of the Constitution of this State, and at the said general election the vote on the said proposed amendment shall be by ballot and upon each ballot there shall be printed the words "For the Constitutional Amendment" and "Against the Constitutional Amendment," as now provided by law, and immediately after said election, due returns shall be made to the Governor of the vote for and against said proposed amendment as directed by Article XIV of the Constitution and further proceedings had in accordance with said Article XIV.
