The Board administers the retirement system and considers applications for disability pensions or retirement (Code 1957, 1961 Supp., Art. 88B, secs. 31, 31A, 49-62).

The Teachers' Retirement System was established by Chapter 344, Acts of 1927. It is administered by a Board of Trustees of five members, three of whom are ex officio members; the remaining two are elected by the membership of the retirement system. The system administers the retirement allowances and benefits for the teachers of the State and is responsible for the proper investment and administration of funds entrusted to its care. In addition to the teachers in the Maryland public schools, the faculty members of the State teachers colleges, the University of Maryland, Morgan State College, and St. Mary's Seminary Junior College are members of the System (Code 1957, Art. 77, secs. 108-129; 1959 Supp., Art. 77, secs. 112-121A; 1960 Supp., Art. 77, secs. 113, 116; 1961 Supp., Art. 77, secs. 108, 190, 198, 199).
