The Governor appointed the Study Group in 1964 to analyze and submit recommendations concerning a proposal for the State to provide a Comprehensive Rehabilitation Center for the severely disabled persons in Maryland. Certain recommendations have been made, but, essential details as to scope, size, and cost of such a Center remain to be determined. A Federal grant has been obtained, one purpose of which is to make such detailed determinations for a Comprehensive Center in the course of developing a complete plan for vocational rehabilitation services in Maryland. Accordingly, in 1965, the Governor broadened the scope of the Study Group's activity and re-designated it as shown. In order to effect coordination and cooperation, the Legislative Council has designated three members of its special Committee for Vocational Rehabilitation to serve as liaison representatives to the Governor's Study Group.
