The Maryland Civil Defense Agency was established by Chapter 563, Acts of 1949. The Director is appointed by the Governor. The Agency prepares for, and in the event of enemy attack or major natural disasters, coordinates emergency function of State agencies and political subdivisions to minimize and repair injury and damage and pointers such visions to minimize and repair injury and damage resulting from such disasters. The Agency assists the country and Baltimore City Civil Defense organizations in the implementation of the National Civil Defense program. It is the agency of State government which aids the political subdivisions of Maryland in the procurement of supplies and equipment for civil defense purposes under the Federal matching funds and surplus property programs; it also
