The Interstate Commission is now in the process of amending the compact to enable it to function not only in water pollution control matters, but also in water resources conservation in the Basin, Maryland (Chapter 29, Acts of 1960), and the West Virginia and Pennsylvania legislatures have adopted these amendments. They were considered by the Virginia legislature in 1966.

The Commission is financed by appropriations from each of the

participating bodies.
