The Chief of Management Information Systems is appointed by the Secretary. This division has the responsibility for automatic data processing planning and for management control of State data processing resources. The division manages and develops State ADP resources according to a master plan and implementation schedule, periodically updated to reflect future information requirements. The division also exercises administrative authority over the Baltimore Data Center (Code 1957, 1968 Repl. Vol., 1972 Supp., Art. 15A, Secs. 23-25).
